

Project No 1 - Getting rid of the washing.



Click on the rectangular marquee tool, and draw a rectangle down the wall left side of where the washing is, take care not to include any of the washing in your selection.



Press Control and T

This will take the marquee tool into transform mode

Click on the right side of the marquee and drag the oblong mask over the washing making sure you have covered all of it, don't worry if you go into the roof, we can soon correct that by going into the history brush tool afterwards and painting back the roof that you have removed.

Double Click the left mouse button inside the oblong to make it permanent.

When satisfied with your new wall, click on Filters and then into Vanishing point

Start above the top window and to the left with your first point; follow down to just below the bottom window, then across to the other side of the bottom window, up to the top to complete your selection, it should be in blue, but if in yellow, move the pointed end pieces until your selection becomes blue.

Now click on square mask tool, and draw a mask around your first window in the blue selection. When happy with the selection, press alt and drag the new window across to a position of your choosing.

Repeat this procedure for the other window, and when completed, press OK to complete the process.

Project No 2 - The Two masked men

Firstly flip passage horizontally so pillars are on the left side.

Control "A": Edit, Transform, Flip Horizontally



Select pen tool and draw round masked men (if you wish just move round the figures by clicking in very short steps). When completed right click inside the selection and click on “make selection”, this will create a flashing line round the figures. Click on move tool, then on the selection and drag into empty passage. Do the same with the Pink Lady if you wish to have more than one selection in your pic.

If you find it difficult to use the pen tool, just mask the two men with one of the other types of marquee tools.



Project No 3 - Panned Shots for CS3 and CS4 users

Take about five pics with 5 Panned shots, making sure you have some of No 1 pic in with No2, and No 2 pic in with No 3, and so on. They can be in Raw, Tiff, or Jpeg.

When downloaded into computer, create folder, so you know where they are.

In Photoshop CS3 or 4 go to: File, Automate, Photo merge, and then find folder with pics in. Select them, and then click OK, the program will do the rest of the procedure.
