

HDR (High Dynamic Range) with Canon EOS 40D

To achieve this with a Canon EOS 40D you use Auto Exposure Bracketing (AEB) which takes three exposures of the same scene: one at the recommended setting, one at a 1/3 f-stop above and one 1/3 f-stop below. It was stated that the images are best shot in RAW. These images are then merged together using Photoshop Automate>Merge to HDR.

AEB can be found on page 94 of the Canon Manual.

It is to be noted that other Canon EOS models also have the AEB feature.
